Introduction

WiN UK is pleased to host the 32nd WiN Global Annual Conference. The theme of our conference is 'Positively Nuclear: Influencing our Future'. The conference will be held in London, United Kingdom, July 14-18th 2025.

The conference will highlight the multitude of positive applications of nuclear energy, science and radiation technology as well as providing opportunities for networking, exchanging ideas, technical visits and obtaining the most up-to-date information on the nuclear programmes and facilities around the world.

WiN is an inclusive organisation that welcomes participation from everyone to ensure we foster an inclusive dialogue throughout the global nuclear community.

Conference Objectives

The objectives of the conference are to:

- Gain insights into the vital role of nuclear energy in achieving a low carbon future.
- Contribute to the global conversation on addressing concerns and dispelling myths.
- Network with like-minded individuals from around the world who are passionate about the future of nuclear power.
- Explore global career opportunities and be inspired to make a difference.
- Contribute to fostering gender balance and diversity in the nuclear sector.

PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITIES

WiN UK are excited to welcome our global WiN community and invite you to participate at the conference via Conference Presentations and the Future Leaders Poster Competition. Specific requirements for each of these opportunities are detailed in the sections below, but in addition both opportunities have the following shared requirements:

- Abstract submission not exceeding 300 words
- Abstract providing enough information to enable the organising committee to evaluate the submission.
- Biography submission not exceeding 200 words including a headshot photograph
- Identification of a lead to complete the application where there is more than one individual associated with the submission.
- Alignment with the theme "Positively Nuclear: Influencing Our Future," highlighting the positive impacts of nuclear technologies, science, and practices, and explore how they can shape the future of the nuclear industry.
- Suitable for the target audience for this conference, comprising professionals working in the nuclear industry, government, supply chain, academia and other stakeholders. Representation from all areas of nuclear applications is expected.

- Topics for all submissions can include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Leadership and Personal Development
 - Safety, Safeguards, and Non-Proliferation
 - Isotope Use and Production
 - Nuclear Power Generation
 - Small Modular Reactors and Advanced Nuclear Technology
 - Decommissioning, Waste Management, and Remediation
 - Radiolabeled Compounds and Radiopharmaceuticals
 - Analytical Methods and Detection Techniques
 - Sustainability and Environment
 - Actinide Chemistry
 - Diversity and Inclusion in Nuclear
 - Education and Training in Nuclear
 - Cross-Cutting Topics

1. CONFERENCE PRESENTATIONS

The organising committee invites applicants to submit abstracts for oral presentations as part of the programme.

Submission Requirements

- Open to all members of the Global WiN community
- An abstract is required that should convey valuable insights in a clear and accessible manner, ensuring they resonate with a diverse audience within the nuclear industry.
- Applicants should plan for their final presentation to be a 15 minute oral presentation with 5 minutes allowed for questions.

Documents for Submission

- Application Form: Includes Abstract (max. 300 words) and Biography (max. 200 words)
- Headshot photograph emailed to abstracts@winglobal2025.uk

2. FUTURE LEADERS POSTER COMPETITION

We encourage members from the academic community, including students enrolled in internships or placements related to the nuclear industry, to participate in our Future Leaders Poster competition. This is a valuable opportunity to share your research with a global audience of industry professionals, academics and peers. Winners of the competition will be invited to a communications workshop in advance of the conference.

Submission Requirements

- Open to PhD Scholars, Post Doctorates and Masters students globally.
- An abstract is required that highlights the positive impact of your research in nuclear and its potential to shape the future.
- A poster is required that conveys the importance of your research to the nuclear community/industry that is suitable for the general public. Please make sure that the poster is submitted in PDF format, is A0 [can be landscape or portrait] and does not use large blocks of text or unexplained scientific jargon or abbreviations.

Documents for Submission

- Application Form: includes Abstract (max. 300 words) and Biography (max. 200 words)
- Poster (PDF, Size A0) and headshot photograph emailed to abstracts@winglobal2025.uk

Please note that all applicants must be available to attend the WiN Global Annual Conference in London, UK, from 14th to 16th July 2025. If you are successful and your submission is accepted for the programme, you must register and purchase your ticket for the conference. Method of Submission

Abstract Evaluation

The organising committee will evaluate all abstracts submitted by the deadline. Abstracts will be evaluated as follows:

- Merit and clarity of the 300-word abstract submission.
- The abstract's originality, relevance, and thoroughness in relation to the conference theme "Positively Nuclear: Influencing our Future."
- We invite submissions that are pitched for a general audience in the nuclear industry, ensuring that complex ideas are communicated in a way that is engaging and comprehensible to all.
