The Walking Tour

This walking tour is a wonderful way to experience the heart of London, especially if you're keen on discovering the iconic landmarks of the West End. Led by friendly, knowledgeable English-speaking volunteers, this bespoke route takes you through some of the city's most famous and historically significant areas. Here's what you can expect on this unforgettable tour:

Highlights of the Walking Tour:

- **Big Ben and the Palace of Westminster:** You'll start by soaking in the grandeur of Big Ben (the Elizabeth Tower) and the Houses of Parliament, two of London's most iconic symbols of British history and democracy.
- **Westminster Abbey:** This majestic Gothic cathedral is the site of many royal weddings, coronations, and funerals. It's a place of deep historical significance.
- **Buckingham Palace:** The official residence of the British monarch in London and one of the most iconic landmarks in the city. You can admire the exterior of the residence and perhaps even catch the Changing of the Guard ceremony if timing allows.
- Victoria Market Halls: A vibrant indoor market offering a range of food stalls, shopping, and local vendors perfect for a quick bite or souvenir hunting.
- **St James Park, The Mall and Admiralty Arch:** St James's Park is one of London's most famous and beautiful parks, located right in the heart of the city. It covers around 57 acres and is bordered by key landmarks like Buckingham Palace to the west, the Horse Guards Parade to the east, and the Mall to the north. As you leave the park there is a short walk along the famous Mall and a chance to see Admiralty Arch.
- **Trafalgar Square:** Home to Nelson's Column and surrounded by statues and fountains, this lively square is a key gathering point in the city. Whilst in this area there is an option to visit the National Gallery. If you're interested in art, this world-class museum in Trafalgar Square is a must-visit, offering a rich collection of European paintings from the 13th to the 19th centuries.
- Horse Guards Parade: Here you can see the Household Cavalry, the oldest active regiment in the British Army, and maybe get your photo taken alongside the Kings horses.
- **Downing Street and Whitehall:** Get a glimpse of the official residences and offices of the British Prime Minister, as well as the government buildings along Whitehall.
- **The Cenotaph:** A moving war memorial dedicated to those who died in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. A poignant stop in the heart of the city.

The 30-minute cruise gives you plenty of time to appreciate the city's skyline and landmarks from the water, whether you're in the enclosed lower deck or enjoying the open-air upper deck for a breeze and great photo opportunities.

After disembarking at Tower Bridge, the walk along the Thames promises a delightful mix of history, culture, and vibrant city life. You'll be able to explore:

- Tower Bridge: One of London's most recognizable structures, with its iconic bascule design.
- **The Tower of London:** Guarded by the famous Beefeaters, also known as Yeoman Warders and home to the Royal Crown Jewels (additional cost for entry).
- **Sky Garden:** A stunning public space located atop the Walkie Talkie building. It's one of the city's most unique and easily accessible gardens, offering panoramic views of the London skyline.
- **Borough Market:** A lively spot for food lovers, offering everything from fresh produce to gourmet street food.
- **Tate Modern:** A world-renowned contemporary art museum housed in a former power station, with stunning views of the Thames from the museum's café.
- **Southbank:** A vibrant cultural hub with theatres, bars, and often street performers, offering a fantastic riverside promenade.

The Bus Tour

Experience the best of the city with our unique combined tour! This combined bus and walking tour offers a fantastic way to experience the best of London in an engaging way. Starting with the iconic red open-top bus, you'll get a great introduction to the city's major landmarks, all from a comfortable vantage point with panoramic views. The prerecorded commentary will guide you through the city's rich history and give you insights into the places you'll be passing by. Key sights you'll see on the bus portion include:

- **Fleet Street:** the historical home of the newspaper industry, you'll pass historical buildings, including the Royal Courts of Justice and Temple Bar.
- **St. Paul's Cathedral:** A masterpiece of architecture designed by Sir Christopher Wren, with a remarkable dome.
- London Bridge: the bus will pass along the Thames, with views of the Shard, Tower Bridge, and the Tower of London.
- **Tower Bridge and the Tower of London:** Two of the most iconic structures in London, steeped in history. The Tower of London is home to the Crown Jewels and Yeoman Warders (also known as Beefeaters).

- **Piccadilly Circus:** Known for its bright lights, bustling atmosphere, and famous Shaftesbury Memorial Fountain (Eros) .
- **The Strand:** drive along one of London's most iconic streets, lined with theatres, historic buildings, and cultural venues like the Royal Courts of Justice.
- **Covent Garden:** the tour will terminate at Covent Garden with its lively market atmosphere, theatres, street performers and the Royal Opera House. A great spot for break, some lunch and to enjoy the hustle and bustle that this energetic area brings.
